GeoCorps America offers paid work experiences for geoscientists of all levels (particularly students) on some of America's most beautiful public lands, including national parks, national forests, and BLM lands. Interns have worked at dozens of fantastic locations, including Denali National Park (AK), Grand Canyon National Park (AZ), Gila National Forest (NM), Craters of the Moon National Monument (ID), and many more! [The Mosaics in Science program](#) offers paid work experiences for students and recent graduates from groups that are underrepresented in the sciences. These experiences include a wide range of sciences, including geoscience, and take place in National Parks throughout the nation.

[GSA/ExxonMobil Bighorn Basin Field Award](#)

This all-expenses-paid undergraduate field program in the Bighorn Basin of north-central Wyoming will enhance your geologic credentials and give you an employment edge by immersing you in a field-based study of integrated basin and petroleum systems analysis.

Each summer twenty students will be awarded \$2,000 each to attend the field camp of their choice based on diversity, economic/financial need and merit.
