



## Comprehensive Emergency Planning for Jails



April 12 - 14, 2010 • Mobile, Alabama

The management of correctional emergencies must begin with a comprehensive vulnerability assessment that identifies emergency planning and response needs for the jail. Emergency planning is a process that begins with a sound foundation in the agency's routine policies and procedures and extends to a comprehensive emergency operation plan that anticipates plans for all situations. This session will provide jail personnel with an overview of the elements of emergency planning and a model process which helps ensure the development of a comprehensive emergency plan for their department. The training will include planning exercises that simulate the actual steps in the development of a jail emergency plan and will conclude with a hypothetical exercise requiring a response to a hypothetical jail emergency. The session will emphasize the importance of structuring the emergency plan in conjunction with the incident command system.

### SEMINAR GOAL

To provide participants with an overview of the jail emergency planning process and to offer new perspectives and practical information that can be used to enhance and/or evaluate jail emergency plans. This seminar is especially geared toward sheriffs, jail administrators, jail managers, and other Jail and County emergency planning personnel.

### SEMINAR OBJECTIVES

- Conduct a facility disaster assessment
- List the four main categories of emergency plan development
- Conduct an emergency resource assessment (internal & external)
- Describe the preliminary response strategies for a jail disturbance
- Describe causes and preventions of facility disturbances
- Describe the Incident Command System (ICS)
- Identify emergency operations needs
- Establish emergency response teams with team missions & duties
- Identify equipment needs (internal and external)

**Joseph J. Marchese**, retired Deputy Director of Criminal Justice for the State of New York has over 38 years of experience in the Criminal Justice field. Mr. Marchese is an internationally recognized consultant in the fields of emergency planning, hostage negotiations, tactical team development, & terrorist/gang interdiction. He has provided training for numerous criminal justice agencies & associations. In 2004, Mr. Marchese was retained by the Irish Prison Service to train Governors (Wardens) & emergency personnel in hostage negotiations & emergency planning. From 1987-89 he served as a Correctional Program Specialist with the US DOJ, National Institute of Corrections. Mr. Marchese has also served as a police officer & senior investigator. Mr. Marchese's degrees include a BS - John Jay College of Criminal Justice and an MA - SUNY Stony Brook.

**Mike Haley**, Ph.D., recently retired as Warden of the Mobile County, AL, Metro Jail. In that capacity, he dealt annually with the threat of hurricanes and storm surges, sheltering in place, evacuation and other emergency situations.
