[Early Educator Central](#) is a collaborative effort of the Office of Child Care and Office of Head Start, within the Administration for Children and Families, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, and is jointly administered by these offices.

Among the features of Early Educator Central are:

- An index of coursework to support infant-toddler educators, who include center- and home-based/family child care teachers.
- Links to infant-toddler development course content that higher education institutions can use within their associate degree program.
- Resources for others with key career roles in early learning, including administrators of early childhood programs, trainers and coaches, higher education professionals and coursework developers, and PD system leaders.
