September 13 & 14, 2017

Four trips to highlight Metal Earth's 2017 fieldwork

September 13th Trips

Trip 1) The Rouyn-Noranda trip will review new mapping of the Kinojevis Group volcanics and banded iron formation (BIF) north of the Porcpine-Destor Fault; VMS-bearing volcanic stratigraphy within the Blake River Group; and the Pontiac Group sediments and their contact relationship with mafic and ultramafic volcanics south of the Cadillac Fault.

Trip 2) The Larder Lake trip will review new work in the Hurst sediments and syenites south of Larder Lake; the Piche Group volcanics and Timiskaming Group sediments associated with gold deposits along the Larder Lake Fault, including new work around the Kerr-Addison Mine.

September 14th Trips

Trip 3) The Malartic trip will review new mapping of the gold mineralized Pontiac Group sediments south of the Cadillac Fault; the Piche Group volcanics and Timiskaming Group sediments north of Fault; komatiites and BIF associated with Ni-Cu deposits of the Malartic Group; and amphibolites along the Manneville Fault in the north.

Trip 4) The Swayze trip will review new mapping of gold mineralized sediments and porphyries associated with the Ridout Fault in the south; jasperitic BIF formation, komatiitic volcanics and Timiskaming-aged volcanic breccias in the central Swayze.

Each trip will last from 9 am to about 4 pm with transportation provided from the pick-up sites. The trips will have their numbers capped based on a first-come, first served basis. Register early if you wish to come!
