WHY ATTEND:

Cytopathologists, cytotechnologists, gynecologists, and related professionals continue to feel the impact of evolving algorithms, emerging technologies, and potential legal issues relating to what they do. 11. Discuss ancillary techniques used to evaluate soft tissue cytohistology.
12. Discuss diagnostic applications of veterinary medicine.
13. Explore a comparative medicine/translational approach to animal modeling of human diseases as they relate to cytologic diagnoses.
14. Describe how cytology can be applied to the identification of animals as sentinels for environmental diseases.
15. Summarize differential diagnostic possibilities for various difficult gynecologic and non-gynecologic cytology cases.
16. Identify diagnostic pitfalls and common errors in challenging cytology specimens.
