



## ASTP Data Now Available in Online, Searchable Format Through AUTM

Deerfield, IL — The Association of University Technology Managers (AUTM), a nonprofit association of academic technology transfer professionals surveys North American universities, hospitals and research institutions each year on a host of data points that reveal licensing activity. These data are made available through STATT, an online, searchable database containing more than 21 years of licensing data.

Now the same data for Europe is available. The AUTM licensing survey was conducted by the Association of European Science & Technology Professionals (ASTP) for its members in corporation with AUTM for fiscal years 2010 and 2009 and this data has been added to AUTM's online database.
