Goal

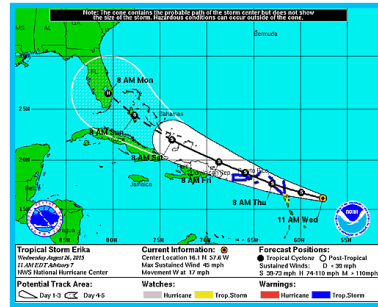
