At no cost, this one day event for up to 30 participants will include the following subject areas:

**Morning Training Session:** Below 100 Training - The goal of this course is to provide the participant with background information, concepts, and techniques to improve officer safety by understanding and implementing the principles of Below 100. Subject areas include,

- Addressing areas within an officer’s control that are resulting in LODDs
- Predictable is Preventable
- The Five Tenets
- WIN – What’s Important Now?
- Line of Duty Deaths: Understanding the Issues
- Implementing Preventative Measures
- Roles and Responsibilities: Officers, FTOs, Supervisors, Leaders, Non-Sworn
- Continuing the Effort

**Afternoon Executive Roundtable:** After the training session, this part of the day is facilitated by Below 100 credentialed trainers and NMLEA staff and is designed for agency leaders and influencers who can make a difference at their organizations. The goal of this part of the workshop is to identify specific steps that can be explored, addressed, applied and implemented as we shape the future of our profession and public safety in general. Some of the discussion areas will include.

- What is Next? What is Important Now?
- What is the Maritime Component, focus and application of Below 100?
- What does our future look like? How can we impact it now?
- What can I do, and what can my agency do to shape the future?
